

SEP CAMPING RULES

On occasions SEP are able to accommodate you on the event site providing you have the appropriate camping equipment.

Should the staffing team advise you that this is the case, you must remember that you are a guest on someone's land and will be in close proximity to team members so acting with care and respect is essential.

The following rules are set out to ensure we can all have a safe, fun and productive time while respecting our environment.

CAMPSITE PITCHES

For safety reasons there may be rules on spacing and fire lanes and you should ask before spending time pitching up.

Keep your unit within a pitch and take care when positioning guy lines and when moving around at night and note that vehicles may not be allowed within the camping area.

SAFETY

- Ensure all butane or propane outlets are maintained and checked regularly for any defects.
- If you smell gas inform the SEP manager or the campsite manager IMMEDIATELY.
- Take care when moving around in the dark.
- Open Fires are not allowed and you should ask before using a BBQ.
- Ensure BBQs are set up safely with no risk of damaging grass etc.
- Do not leave fresh food in your pitch unrefrigerated.
- Keep to site speed limits when driving

ELECTRIC SUPPLY

Please note that electric hook up is unlikely to be available and where it is, may for logistical reasons be restricted to the most regular team members and may not be on full time.

However if power is available you MUST:

- Ensure your leads and equipment is in good condition and undamaged.
- Only use C-Form outdoor connectors.
- Speak to the Event Manager or Campsite Manager before plugging in to the generator/splitters.
- The use of kettles, microwaves and similar will overload the system and are banned.
- Always ask the campsite/Event Manager before switching on the generator.

RUBBISH

Basically leave the area exactly as you find it

- All rubbish must be placed in black bin liners and disposed of in the skips provided.
- Bring bin liners with you or ask if you run short
- DO NOT leave left over food or any personal belongings on the floor.
- Keep your area tidy - do not leave it for somebody else to pick up!
- Disposable BBQ's must be fully extinguished before disposed of. Ensure the BBQ is lifted off the ground to avoid scorching the grass.
- Any litter during or after an event will be not tolerated.

NOISE

- Noise after 22:00 will not be tolerated.
- Please be aware that at some events we have different shift patterns. You may be awake but others may still be asleep.
- Generators will be turned off at an appropriate time. Not all events have 24hr power.

FIRE

If there is a fire in the campsite:

- INFORM the event manager immediately, they will then contact the event fire marshals who will deal with the matter.
- NEVER attempt to put out the fire yourself.
- CLEAR everybody away from the fire in a calm and orderly fashion.
- LEAVE ALL belongings behind.

BBQ's, GAS STOVES AND OTHER FUEL-BURNING APPLIANCES

Any equipment which uses gas, wood, petrol, oil, kerosene, or diesel can pose a risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. This includes camping stoves and fuel burning lamps, fridges, heaters, generators, and any other fuel-burning equipment.

- Never use a BBQ or a fuel burning appliance inside a tent, awning, caravan or any other enclosed space.
- Never use a BBQ, fuel burning heater or appliance to warm your tent, caravan or sleeping area.
- Always make sure the area in which you use a BBQ or a fuel burning appliance is well ventilated.
- Always make sure your equipment is in good working order and that any hoses are securely attached and not damaged. Change your canisters in a well-ventilated open space, follow the manufacturer's guidelines carefully and be sure to turn off the supply properly before doing so.
- There are safe ways to keep warm when camping. Extra insulation above and below your bed will really help keep you warm when sleeping.
- Remember Carbon Monoxide has NO SMELL, NO TASTE, NO COLOUR.
- Early stages of poisoning are headaches and dizziness.
- Later stages of poisoning are vomiting, nausea, drowsiness and weakness.

ANIMALS

- Please be aware that we do not allow pets on site. You will be asked to leave if you bring your pet with you.
